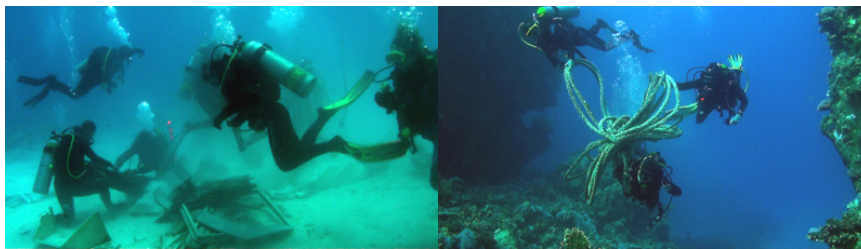


Jeff Goodman Blog for Cameras Underwater April 2011

Usually for me, being in the Red Sea means I am at **Marsa Shagra** doing the video and editing courses. Instead I am here volunteering to film part of '**World Earth Day**'. As a element of this, a team of holiday divers are giving up a day to clean surrounding reefs, and beaches of any garbage. I have joined a team going out to Shaab Samadai or 'Dolphin House' reef to film the continued clearing up of the remains of a ship that hit the reef some years ago. The bulk of the wreck has now been taken away but there still remain heavy timbers, plastic and metal parts of the ship. **All the photos here are taken from Video images with equipment supplied from Cameras Underwater in Devon.**



Also helping in the clear up are members from 'The Changing Oceans Expedition' which is campaigning for an improved network of marine protected areas to help preserve our oceans. The expedition was launched in 2009 on board Fleur de Passion, a 33 meter sailing boat. Supported by **Cameras Underwater**, I volunteered for the expedition a few months ago to help document the Red Sea leg of their journey.

The objective is to visit 100 of the worlds most important marine Eco-regions in 10 years, measuring the pace of change in our Oceans and providing a point of reference for future generations. Scientific projects are carried out onboard in collaboration with universities around the globe, as well as an awareness program with documentaries, multimedia, educational tools and Internet. In addition the expedition supports socio educative projects and invites members of the public to join the adventure to help preserving our oceans.
